Building on his reputation of creating films that challenge, provoke, and inspire filmmaker DJ Kadagian has created three films, RANT, RAVE, & RIFF, featuring powerful poetry of some the masters - Pablo Neruda, Jalal ad-Din Rumi, Carl Sandberg, Langston Hughes, Antonio Machado, and others. "Great poetry should be performed by great poets," says Kadagian.

To that end, he sought out Robert Bly and Coleman Barks among others who perform the poems in the film, providing some of the translation. Mixing visually powerful footage with a dynamic soundtrack these films will literally transport you through time and space. You will find yourself in the front seat of the Cyclone in 1940s Coney Island, scrambling for cover in present day Iraq or on the Space Shuttle looking back at earth. Perhaps a smoky tango bar in 1922 Argentina is more to your liking.

We will see a 1 hour compilation of all three movies. After the film, there will be an opportunity to ask questions and discuss the films with Mr. Kadagian.

FROM THE BOARD

"*The secret of success is constancy of purpose.*" This quotation, from Benjamin Disraeli, the noted British statesman of the 19th century, is appropriate for us at the Library, determined as we are to improve our services to the community.

In the last *Overleaf* newsletter I wrote about some of the issues that our Long-Range Planning Committee has been tackling. Its work has been constant and its purpose continues, as specific points in need of change and improvement have been identified. After presentation to the Board of Trustees, two of these, *Overleaf* and *Circulation*, will be ready for implementation.

1. Our *Overleaf* newsletter is a vital link to the Hewlett-Woodmere community, listing and highlighting the remarkable programs we have available. So much is scheduled in our building, and the activities are so varied, that four three-month installments cannot really provide the reader with enough information and clarity. The Committee decided, therefore, to present to the Board of Trustees its proposal that the newsletter be published bi-monthly, with the resulting *six* issues also to be expanded in a manner that will make it easier to decide among the Library's many offerings.

2. *Circulation*, the checking out and returning of books, can sometimes be frustrating in a library as busy as ours, but technology has made it possible to simplify and accelerate the procedures. The Committee has recommended the installation of systems that will expedite the process. More information on this will be provided.

Final Committee recommendations on *Collections and Services*, *Finance*, *the Physical Plant*, and *Community Outreach* will soon be ready.
